Format for Research Proposal pitches

- Order will be determined according to volunteerism
- Format is ~5 minute 'elevator pitch'
- Pitch should include:
 - What is the important context regarding the problem that will be addressed?
 - How do you propose to solve the problem?
 - What methods / experiments / techniques might you use in your approach?
- Open discussion will follow with questions from peers and instructors

Use pitch feedback to refine your proposal

- What problem will you solve?
- How does your solution relate to biological engineering?
- What components should be included in your proposal?
 - Background / overview
 - Research question / goal
 - Specific aims
 - Experimental approach (for each aim)
 - Alternative approaches (for key experiments)
 - Societal / ethical implications
 - Summary

Define co-investigator roles for your team
